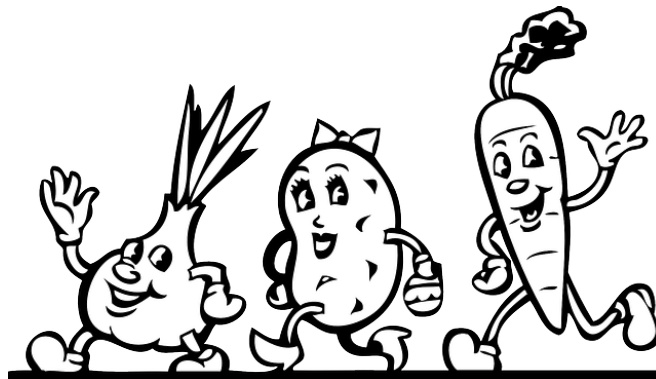


Conditions for all Shows

1. One entry per exhibitor allowed in each class.
2. No artificial flowers or foliage will be allowed, unless otherwise stated.
3. All pots must stand in saucers.
4. All vegetables, fruit and flower exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession for at least 3 months.
Flower arrangements excepted.
5. All exhibits to be grown by the exhibitor except in Classes 56-58 and 59-63 in the Summer Show and Classes 81-83 and 84-92 in the Autumn Show.
6. Exhibits to be named where possible.
7. All exhibits to become the property of the Association unless "Not for Sale" tickets are attached to the entry. Produce to be auctioned at 4.00pm for Association Funds.
8. The hall will be open from 9.00am to 11.30am on the day of the show for staging exhibits.
9. Judging will commence at 12.00pm and the hall will be cleared except for Judges and Stewards.
10. The show will be open to members and the public from 2.00pm.
11. No exhibit to be removed before 3.45pm without the permission of the Show Co-ordinator.
12. The Association can accept no responsibility for loss or damage of exhibits.

14. For the Floral Art Section (Classes 56-58 in the Summer Show and Classes 81-83 in the Autumn Show) the word "Exhibit" shall mean plant material with or without accessories.
15. The judge's decision is final.
16. Any queries must be brought to the attention of the Show Secretary 15 minutes prior to the tables being cleared

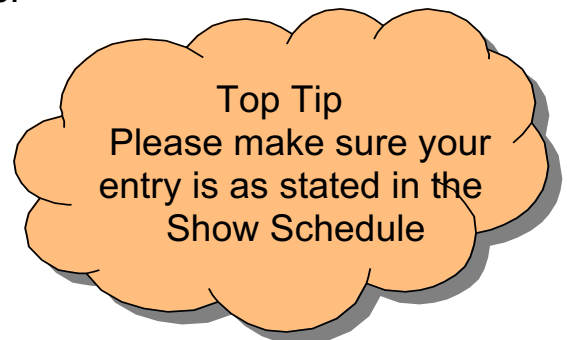
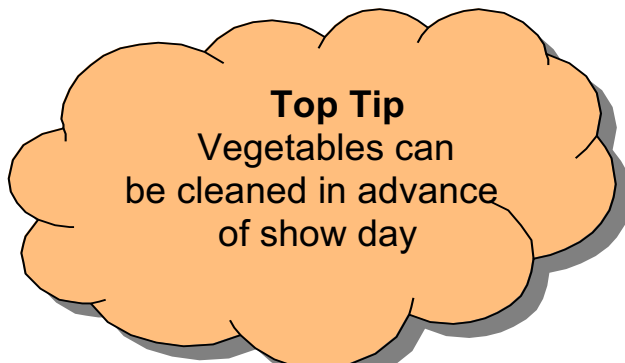
